Regenerative Medicines and their impact on Healthcare: from lab to market

According to global regenerative medicines market forecasts, it is expected to reach \$30,237 million by 2022. Researchers from universities, hospitals and private companies continue to progress on developing technologies for a wide array of degenerative conditions, each with different scientific strengths and weaknesses. However, the path toward the commercialization is still not clear. There is a need for investments in infrastructure, increased research and development spending, but also new collaborations between institutions and businesses all around the world. No one will succeed alone.
