

SELECTION PROCESS

SUPERIOR DEGREE TECHNICIAN FOR PUBLIC PROCUREMENT OF INNOVATION PROJECT

The Catalan Institute of Oncology (ICO), public center of the Health Department of the Government of Catalonia, leader in oncology and dedicated to patient care, research, prevention and specialised training, starts a selection process to incorporate a **Superior Degree Project Technician** at L'Hospital of Llobregat (Barcelona) under the supervision of Enric Limon (VINCat Program Coordinator) / Tàrsila Ferro (Director of Innovation and Quality).

In 2006 the VINCat Program was established in order to develop and support a standardized surveillance system of hospital-acquired infections (HAI) in Catalonia (Spain). All acute care hospitals included in the public health system network of Catalonia were invited to participate.

The aim was to provide risk-adjusted, procedure-specific rates for most relevant infections. Data are collected by the local multidisciplinary infection control teams and transmitted electronically to the Coordinating Centre, which acts as the core of a network of infection control committees and has the support of a Technical Advisory Committee. The program website provides updated information on program activities, training workshops, aggregated data on past infection rates and access to databases, manuals and protocols.

The VINCat Program and the Catalan Institute of Oncology (ICO) jointly participate in the RaDAR Project (Rapid Detection and control system for Antimicrobial Resistance), a Co-financing of public procurement of innovation consortia, co-funded by the COSME Program of the European Union (COS-PPI-2020-2-04).



MAIN TASKS:

- The Project Technician will mainly perform the tasks devoted to ICO and VinCat within the RADAR Project, particularly to:
- Support the Principal Investigator (PI) and researchers of the team, leaders of the Work Package (WP) and national coordinators of the RaDAR project.
- Monitor the participation of the team in the development of the different Work Packages (WP), in direct relation with the WP leaders of the project.
- The main contribution of the team will be related to clinical demand definition, public procurement execution and guidelines development.
- Prepare follow-up and deliverables reports according to the RaDAR Project schedule.
- Prepare and attend RaDAR online and face-to-face coordination meetings.
- Collaborate in the preparation of the scientific reports of the RaDAR project with the

PI and researchers of the team.

- Participate in obtaining, interpreting and disseminating results of the RaDAR Project.
- Dissemination and communication activities of the RaDAR Project.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Bachelor degree preferably in life sciences (medicine, biomedical sciences, biology, public health).
- Complementary education in microbiology, public health and epidemiology.
- Research and/or project management in European Commission funded projects.
- Participation in international collaborative projects.
- Good command of English language.

TECHNICAL SKILLS:

- Excellent abilities of working in group and individually.
- Initiative and motivation to develop the projects in efficient and collaborative manner.
- To be able to multitask and prioritize.
- Good command of basic MS Office and online meeting tools.
- Good writing skills.
