## GOOD PRACTICES FOR FOSTERING TRANSFORMATIVE RESEARCH IN HEALTH AND LIFE SCIENCES

**Jordi Camí**, M.D., Ph. D. Director of [Pasqual Maragall Foundation](#) and of the [Barcelona Biomedical Research Park](#) (PRBB)

For the past 20 years Jordi Camí's research activity has been focused in the field of neuroscience, in particular in the clinical pharmacology of drug abuse. He is author of more than 150 publications and several monographs and has been awarded with several prizes including the honorable mention of Queen Sofia's Research Award in 1990 and the Narcís Monturiol medal to scientific and technological merits in 2000. Between 1997 and 2000 he was responsible for the creation and development of the Health and Life Sciences degree studies and an international PhD program in Biomedicine at the Universitat Pompeu Fabra. Between 1985 and 2005, he ran the Municipal Institute for Medical Research (IMIM), where he promoted the Antidoping Laboratory to be authorized by the International Olympic Committee. He was the promoter and is currently the manager of the Barcelona Biomedical Research Park (PRBB), which hosts six biomedical research centers with more than 1,400 people. Under his leadership, the IMIM received the Narcís Monturiol plaque in 2003, and in 2006 the PRBB was awarded with the City of Barcelona Prize for contributing to the international projection of the city. He is a member of the Advisory Health Council for the Ministry of Health and its Executive Commission. He is also member of the Spanish Bioethics Committee, and presently, he is the managing director of the Pasqual Maragall Foundation for Research on Alzheimer's disease.
