## **Research Description**

IJC is looking for a **Laboratory Technician** to join the **Lymphoid neoplasms** group, led by **Dr. Tomas Navarro**. The research group focuses on the study of lymphomas that affect immunosuppressed patients, both in clinical and genetic aspects. We have made important contributions in this field and our current objective is to unveil genetic and epigenetic characteristics of lymphoid neoplasms that occur mainly in immunosuppressed patients. The purpose is to find markers for a more accurate management of these patients. Furthermore, we aim to implement liquid biopsy as a tool for diagnosis and follow-up of aggressive lymphomas.
